



DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. – The Embry-Riddle men’s basketball program got off to an early start with its 2010-11 recruiting process as Brandon Serle signed a letter of intent to play for the Eagles on Friday.

Serle is a local product who is entering his fourth season playing for Coach Eddie Miller at Father Lopez High School. A 6-6, 170-pound forward, Serle was a three-time Daytona Beach News Journal All-Area selection, earning honorable mention honors as a freshman, third team honors as a sophomore and second team recognition as a junior. He averaged 13 points and nine rebounds per game in 2008-09 en route District MVP honors.

The two-year team captain also got the job done in the classroom, earning honors in geometry and algebra.

“Brandon is the epitome of an outstanding student, person and player,” ERAU head coach Steve Ridder stated. “He has tremendous upside with his versatility and his ability to play multiple positions. He’s very familiar with our program having been a basketball camper and a member of the Junior Eagles program. I love his competitive fire and I think he has a chance to be a very special player and an outstanding leader in years to come. I am very excited to have him and his family joins the Embry-Riddle family.”

Serle will pursue a degree in Mechanical Engineering at Embry-Riddle.
