From the Principal's Desk

Dear Lopez Families,

This past week Mrs. Katelyn Fisher, Mrs. Marie Gallo-Lethcoe and I attended an informational workshop regarding our accreditation. We are currently accredited my AdvancEd, (formerly SACS) and our next accreditation journey will result in a duel certification through both AdvancEd and the FCC (Florida Catholic Conference). Many already know that accreditation is the process of using a set of rigorous research-based standards and evidence based criteria to examine an educational institution to determine the schools' effectiveness and faithfulness to its' mission. A popular misconception is that the process is only engaged in during an accreditation year. In fact, accreditation should be an exercise in continued improvement. We will begin a self-study this year that will be used to inform a formal accreditation visit next year. We will be asking for your help in this process. Minimally, we will be asking for participation in surveys, but we would also like to engage some of our parents more intimately in the process.

Last Spring, I served as a team member for another schools' visit in Boca Raton. The school was a faith-based high school about our size and it was enlightening to see the process from that perspective. In the conference room of this school where the team spent the better part of two days, there is a quote painted on the wall. It says, "Good is the enemy of great". While I was happy to be at this school to serve, the quote made me long to be back at Father Lopez. We enjoy so many blessings at Father Lopez. Our campus is beautiful and our faculty are impressive and caring. Most of all, our starting point each year is an extraordinary and dedicated group of students whose families care deeply about education and are committed to the process. We start with everyone planning on and expecting to graduate. Sadly, this is not the case at every high school. The threat is that when you are bestowed with blessings like ours, you may fall into the trap of being complacent, or comfortable with being "good". The reality is that without any exceptional effort on our part, many of our students will achieve great success, our PSAT scores will be higher than the state and national average, and nearly all of our students will graduate and go on to pursue their education further.

My team and I are committed to raising this bar on a daily basis. We are not satisfied with the achievement that comes easily and could be described as "good". Our goal is excellence and I am so thankful to all of you who help support this mission everyday.
